## SPORT SPECIAL INITIATIVES GRANT

#### **Program Purpose:**

- To provide assistance to a Community Sport Partner who is working in partnership with a Provincial Sport Organization for a project, event or activity that would assist in the development of community based sport and is not eligible under any other grant.

#### **Criteria**

- The funding request must clearly outline how that initiative will assist in meeting the needs of the athletes, coaches, officials or volunteers.
- The project, event or activity should contain an educational component.
- Regional Sport Specific Associations are eligible to apply for developmental funding. Before applying please contact your respective regional manager.
- Examples: Women in Sport Workshop, Sport for Life initiative, Community Sport Festival, Fair Play Conference or initiative, Long Term Planning Sessions, Volunteer/Organizational Development Workshops, Non-certification clinics such as Hockey's IP Clinic, Minor Officials Clinics, drills clinics, new coaches orientation clinic, program/lesson planning clinic, meet managers clinic, taping clinics, scorekeeper/timekeeper clinics, pre-level one clinics such as ones offered by soccer, hockey and curling, etc.
- Receipts are mandatory with post event report.

#### **Funding Levels**

- Up to a maximum of \$500.00 per community sport partner per year.
- Applicant's grant/share is 50% of the eligible expenses.
- Eligibility does not ensure assistance.

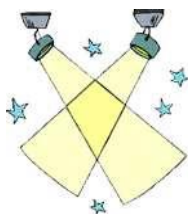

## KIDSPORT™

Sport provides kids with a sense of belonging, self-esteem and confidence, while teaching them valuable life skills. Since not every child has the chance to experience sport because of a family's financial limitations, it is KidSport's goal to enable as many of Manitoba's less-fortunate children as possible to participate in sport, realize its benefits and improve their future.

The Central KidSport Committee has completed the 2009 Fall KidSport review in which 147 applications were submitted requesting approximately \$30,361.45 in assistance. Based on eligibility of the applicants 137 of the applications were approved and \$27,223.45 in KidSport™ funding was disbursed.

Overall in 2009 the Central KidSport program was able to support a total of 193 children by disbursing \$32,174.45 in funds. This amount was made possible with the help of corporate support from Winkler & Portage la Prairie Canadian Tire, Real Canadian Superstore Winkler, and Great-West Life. In addition, many thanks to the following groups for their generous donations in 2009: Morden Youth in Philanthropy, Citizen's on Patrol Program - Portage la Prairie, Manitoba Hockey Hall of Fame and Museum Inc., Morden Minor Hockey, Yellowquill School, R. M. of Louise, R.M. of Morris and R. M. of Rhineland.

With the continued help of community groups, schools, municipalities and corporate support, the committee hopes that more funds can be generated in 2010 so that more children are given the opportunity to get off the sidelines and get involved with organized sports.

## Heart & Stroke's 2009 Automated External Defibrillator (AED) Challenge

For the second year in a row, the Heart & Stroke Foundation of Manitoba (HSFM) is challenging organizations across Manitoba to purchase a Complete AED Package (including a 4 hour training session for 8 people) at a reduced-package rate of \$2,800 (taxes included), for placement in all facilities that house a large number of people.

Due to the resounding success of the first AED Challenge last year, the Heart and Stroke Foundation of Manitoba is once again inviting all organizations across Manitoba to take part in the 2nd annual AED Challenge this November during CPR Month.

Last year, HSFM challenged organizations across the province to purchase an AED at a reduced-package rate for placement in any facility that houses a large number of people. As a result, 90 AEDs were placed in public facilities such as hockey arenas, clinics, schools, fire departments, and community centres. Many AEDs were placed in rural communities where access to AED-equipped ambulances and hospitals is limited. In Minnedosa alone, 11 AEDs were purchased for placement throughout the town by the Minnedosa Credit Union and the Minnedosa Lions Club.

Far too many Manitobans die each year from sudden cardiac arrest in public places, the workplace or at home. Bystander CPR and early first responder defibrillation have been significantly associated with increased survival rates for people in cardiac arrest. **In fact, if an Automated External Defibrillator (AED) is used in combination with CPR - the chance of survival may be increased by 75 per cent or more.** The Heart and Stroke Foundation knows that having an AED in close proximity to people can save lives; that is why we're advocating for the placement of AEDs in all public places, to make them as commonplace as fire extinguishers.
